

# HEALTH INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS

Every incoming student must have the following documentation:

1. Report of Health Examination for School Entry
  - For pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, and new-to-the-school first grade students, this must be completed by an MD or Nurse Practitioner within six (6) months of the start of school.
  - For new-to-the-school second through eighth grade students, a physical exam completed within the past two years meets this requirement.
  - Parents must submit the California Report of Health Check-up for School Entry (CHDP): (PM 171-A) to the school office,
  
2. Documentation of TB Screening
  - This must be done within 6 months of the start of school.
  - Acceptable screening methods include the PPD or Mantoux skin test, or a physician's signed statement of "negative symptom screening" or "no risk assessment". PPD must be documented by your health care provider. This means you must have the test read 48-72 hours after it is given.
  - Tine tests are not acceptable for TB screening requirements.
  
3. A Original Copy of the California School Immunization Record (PM 286)
  - This is a legal document and will follow your child with his/her cum file when he/she graduates or transfers to another school.
  - No child may be admitted as a student of a school unless s/he has been immunized according to California immunization requirements.
  - An original copy of your child's immunization records is required unless you have a computer printout of your child's record.
  - The Hepatitis B series is required for kindergarten and 7th grade students.
  - Documentation of a measles vaccine is required for all kindergarten and 7th grade students.
  - Documentation of chicken pox vaccine or past episode of the disease is required for kindergarten.
  
4. Special Health Needs Plan for Students with Chronic Medical Problems
  - A form is attached that must be completed for students with special health needs. It must be signed by the child's health care provider.
  - Special health needs would include asthma, diabetes, seizures, severe allergies, and the like.
  - The plan should address signs and symptoms, acute management, and indications for phoning 911.

The above are specific requirements of the State of California and/or All Saints Catholic School and the Diocese of Oakland. Parents are required to provide complete documentation PRIOR to the start of the 2009-2010 school year. Children without proper documentation will not be allowed to attend school until such requirements are met.

**Documentation should be provided to All Saints by June 19th.**

Please note: If your child needs a physical examination and/or PPD and has not had these within the time periods stated above, please schedule an appointment with his/her pediatrician NOW to ensure that appropriate documentation can be provided to All Saints before the start of school.
